Hello everyone and I hope your summer is going well. Our June dance was a definite success. Everyone loved our new venue the American Legion Hall 509. Lots of new people attended.



THE COTTON CLUB

In 1920, heavyweight boxing champion [Jack Johnson](#) rented the upper floor of the building on the corner of 142nd



Street and Lenox Avenue right in the Heart of Harlem. He opened an intimate supper club he named the Club Deluxe. Owey Madden, a prominent bootlegger and gangster, took over the club after his release from Sing Sing Prison in 1923 and changed its name to the Cotton Club. The two arranged a deal that allowed Johnson to remain the club's manager. Madden used the Cotton Club as an outlet to sell his #1 beer to the prohibition crowd. When the club closed briefly in 1925 for selling liquor, it soon reopened without interference from the police.

West Texas Western Swing Festival, SnyderTX

In June, we traveled to Snyder Texas to attend the West Texas Western Swing Festival. We then all loaded into a van for the hour and a half drive to Snyder, Texas. Just before we drove out of town, we stopped across from the Buddy Holly Museum and had a home cooked meal at the Cast Iron Grill. 

Herman Stark then became the stage manager. Harlem producer [Leonard Harper](#) directed the first two of three opening night floor-shows at the new venue.

[Cab Calloway](#)'s orchestra brought its "Brown Sugar" revue to the club in 1930, replacing Ellington's orchestra after its departure in 1931. [Jimmie Lunceford](#)'s band replaced Calloway's in 1934. Ellington, Calloway, and Louis Armstrong returned to perform at the club in later years. [Lena Horne](#) (Leona Laviscount) began at the Cotton Club as a chorus girl at the age of sixteen, and sang "Sweeter than Sweet" with Calloway. [Dorothy Dandridge](#) performed at the club while part of the [Dandridge Sisters](#), and [Coleman Hawkins](#) and [Don Redman](#) played at the club as part of Henderson's band. Tap dancers [Bill "Bojangles" Robinson](#), [Sammy Davis Jr.](#) (as part of the [Will Mastin Trio](#)), and the [Nicholas Brothers](#) performed at the club as well.

The Cotton Club closed permanently in 1940 under pressure from higher rents, changing taste, and a federal investigation into [tax evasion](#) by Manhattan nightclub owners. The [Latin Quarter](#) nightclub opened in its space and the building was torn down in 1989 to build a hotel. The Broadway Cotton Club successfully blended the old and new; the site was new and the décor was slightly different, but once a customer was seated it felt like a familiar place.

I think it was both Friday and Saturday after the dancing that we went and had margarita's and home made ice cream made by our good friends Jeff and Sharon. I (Alfredo) never drink but Jeff's margarita was to say the least, delicious. Makes you a little wobbly when you are trying to get ready for bed.

Sunday there is no music or dancing in this part of the Bible Belt. We all loaded up into our van and returned to Lubbock where we all boarded our respective flights and went home. This turned out to be one of the best festivals we have attended. The festival seems to draw the same nice and friendly people that we so enjoy at our Trad Festivals. Already the group is planning on returning next year but also attending another festival in Wichita Falls, Texas.

Dick would play in the Jazz Band every year for Art Drollet's Birthday Parties at the Champlain location in August. He also played all around town as well. He loved jazz and Mardi Gras. They have all passed except Ron DuBois who still comes and has lunch every Wednesday to carry on the tradition. Dick is very much missed on Wednesdays as well as all of them. We are grateful to still have our friend Ron with us every Wednesday. Cheers to you Dick Douty.




