Leon Bismark (Bix) Beiderbecke (1903–1931)

BIX was born on March 10, 1903, in Davenport, Iowa. He was the son of Bismark Herman and Agnes Jane Beiderbecke. His father was Manager of the East Davenport Lumber and Coal Company. His mother was a musician who played piano; she also was the organist for The First Presbyterian Church.

Bix Beiderbecke was the first talented white jazz cornet player. He also played the piano, but he had more success playing the cornet with a very personal style.

His first gig was in 1921 at Hayne's Dancing School under his own name The Beiderbecke Five.

After leaving Lake Forest, he played with several bands around Chicago & Davenport, joining the Wolverine Orchestra in 1924. In October 1924, Bix left The Wolverines and joined The Jean Goldkette Orchestra. He returned home in 1925 and briefly attended the University of Iowa. He then returned to play with Jean Goldkette. In October 1927, Bix joined Paul Whiteman. The Whiteman Orchestra, which had their own train, was on national radio, and played every major concert hall in the USA, including Carnegie Hall, where Bix played his own composition "In A Mist". Bix continued with Whiteman until September 1929.

Bix was a genius, a jazz pioneer. Bix wrote the compositions: In A Mist, Candlelights, In The Dark and Flashes, he also wrote Davenport Blues.

Bix died on Thursday August 6, 1931 at 9:30 pm at the age of 28 from Lobar Pneumonia in Queens, New York. His body was returned to Davenport and buried in Oakdale Cemetery.
